

Presidential Libraries



Steve Lee, recipient of an Eli Lilly Creativity Grant for \$10,000, spoke about his visit to 13 presidential libraries. Only 74 people have visited all thirteen libraries and Steve is one of these. The 1955 Presidential Library Act provided that presidential libraries built by private funds would be maintained with federal funds. His presentation, "Dare to Dream," was the culmination of 4 1/2 weeks and 12,000 miles using all kinds of transportation (bus, car, train and air plane). He offered information on presidents' lives which was gained through report cards, letters, and activities in which they participated. Presidents have come from all socio-economic backgrounds and have displayed a variety of academic

and physical abilities. Some had excellent health and some were sick as They had a variety of children. interests and careers. Some of the libraries were interactive. What all presidents had in common was a mentor who recognized the would who youngsters become presidents the willingness to set goals and reach the goals. Steve talked about the mentors for some of the presidents. Steve made the point that anyone can be a leader and become a president.
