help. She left me with her well-behaved class and within minutes had the situation under control. Cheryl had (and still has) strong ideas and opinions about what kindergarten should be and to me exemplified the very best in teaching. I asked Cheryl to answer some questions for me via email to find out more about her and how she is motivated to make a difference. Here is our email interview.



Sheila: To what or to whom do you attribute your drive to make a difference?

Cheryl: Small town living is a good thing! Growing up in North Judson I was surrounded by family and friends who believed in a strong work ethic.
