Kid's Closet

Kid's Closet, the brain child of Linda Lewandowski, began in 2012. Her mission was to see that no child in Starke County would be without adequate clothing. What started as a small project with trips to yard sales with family members and friends has developed into a large-scale project serving over 900 children in 2016.



Kid's Closet accepts gently used clothing and new clothing and shoes. Each child served receives seven outfits, a coat, boots, pajamas, a hygiene kit, seven pairs of new underwear, socks, hats, gloves, and shoes. Infants and toddlers receive twelve outfits. School supplies are provided yearround.



A volunteer from Kid's Closet takes the clothing to the child's home and ensures that the clothing fits before leaving. Because this is a ministry of the United Methodist Church of North Judson, the volunteer prays with the family before leaving.

Kid's Closet receives donations from the community, grants from Walmart, KV REMC, and the Northern Indiana Community Foundation. They also hold fund raisers such as rummage sales and fish fries.
