PROGRAM: CASA

Rhonda Adcock, the Director of CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates), spoke about the CASA program in Starke County. Each CASA volunteer undergoes training which involve nine Tuesdays. These volunteers advocate for abused and neglected children in court. They may see some of the children on a daily basis and can

make a real difference for the better in a child's life.



Because of privacy rules, Rhonda could not disclose particulars. However, she did say that the amount of poverty and neglect in Starke County is alarming. Many children live in unfit homes, too dirty for human habitation. There is also generational poverty, a culture of poverty, in which the way of life seems "normal" to those living it.

CASA volunteers can give children a broader view of life and opportunities. Rhonda encouraged Alpha Sigma members to consider becoming CASA volunteers.
