Revitalization

At the September meeting, Stephanie Walsh spoke to the Alpha Sigma chapter via Zoom concerning revitalization. There will be a meeting on October 29, 2022, in Indianapolis which will focus on gaining new DKG members and retaining once inducted. Any DKG member may attend.

Committee Focus: Membership

The Membership Committee has several responsibilities according to our chapter policies. Just as our State is tackling the question of membership revitalization, our chapter Membership Committee is responsible for providing direction in the continual effort to gain and retain members.

The Membership Committee is also responsible for submitting qualified candidates for chapter vote. The Committee depends upon all the members of Alpha Sigma to submit recommendations for possible induction into the Society. A New Member Prospect Card is available online at www.alphasigmain.org.

According to Alpha Sigma Policies, the Membership Committee sends a card to any member upon the death of an immediate family member.

A single red rose is sent and a memorial service is conducted upon the death of a member. The Membership Committee is responsible for these observances for deceased members.

A final responsibility is to submit necrology and membership reports as required. The Membership Committee is a vital component of the successful operation of the Alpha Sigma Chapter. The Membership Committee of Alpha Sigma is comprised of Chairman Jo Ann Gappa, Heather Quinn, and Angela Allender.

Woman of Distinction Award

State President Stephanie Walsh requests that nominations for "Woman of Distinction" be sent to her on or before March 1, 2023. To be considered for this award, the nominee must be a DKG member who has excelled in areas other than DKG or who has received a special award.
